Dear parishioners of the English mission,

In order to keep the mission financially viable, we are setting up direct debits bank transfers in order to pledge a set amount of money each month. It should not be forgotten that the clergy who serve you must come from abroad, and have considerable expenses. There are also the expenses of venue in which we offer the Mass. It is our hope to provide England with a resident priest one day. In order to do so, however, we need a firm financial commitment from the English Catholics. For the expenses of a resident priest would be far greater than those of visiting priests, when one considers housing, a vehicle, food, utilities, insurance, and other necessities of life. Nonetheless, this goal is something which we need to attain, in order that the priest can be there for you when you are dying. What we are doing at present is merely a beginning. ## Confession Aid Part 2—Examination of conscience

### The ten commandments

**I am the Lord thy God; thou shalt not have strange gods before Me.**

The first commandment forbids the worship of false gods, belief in fortune tellers or astrology.

**Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.**

The second commandment forbids all false, rash, unjust and unnecessary oaths, blasphemy, cursing and profane words.

**Remember, thou keep holy the Sabbath day.**

The third commandment obliges us to hear Mass on Sundays and Holydays of obligation; forbids all unnecessary servile work.

**Honor thy father and thy mother.**

The fourth commandment forbids all disobedience, contempt and stubbornness towards our parents or lawful superiors.

**Thou shalt not kill.**

The fifth commandment forbids all willful murder, fighting, anger, hatred, revenge and bad example; abortion and unlawful birth control.

**Thou shalt not commit adultery. 9. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife.**

The sixth and ninth commandments forbid unchaste thoughts or desires for another's husband or wife; all impurity and immodesty in words, looks, thoughts and actions, whether alone or with others.

**Thou shalt not steal.**

The seventh commandment forbids all unjust taking or keeping what belongs to another.

**Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.**

The eighth commandment forbids all rash judgment, back-biting, slander and lies.

**Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods.**

The tenth commandment forbids all desires to take or keep wrongfully what belongs to another.

Assist at Mass on Sundays and Holydays of obligation.

To fast and abstain on the days appointed.

To confess our sins at least once a year.

To receive Holy Communion during Easter time.

To contribute to the support of the Church.

To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.
